Graduate and Undergraduate teaching opportunities are available, depending on qualifications. Faculty practice opportunities may be available through the College's seven nurse-managed clinics. A Center for Nursing Research supports faculty and student scholarship.

The College of Nursing Graduate Programs include MSN, BSN-DNP, MSN-DNP, and PhD. Role preparations in MSN and DNP programs include family nurse practitioner, adult/gerontology primary care nurse practitioner, psychiatric/mental health nurse practitioner, nursing education, nursing administration, and executive leadership. Post-MSN and Post-DNP certificate programs are also offered. PhD in Nursing is strongly preferred. Teaching experience and record of active, funded scholarship is preferred. An interest or expertise in rural practice, vulnerable populations, and health disparities is preferred.

Knowledge, Skills & Abilities

All applicants must demonstrate the ability to communicate effectively in written and spoken English. Excellent interpersonal skills and the ability to contribute to a team environment are required. Priority will be given to those applicants that qualify for a tenure-track position. Advanced practice certification required for some teaching assignments.
